Competitions included - gymnastics, football, athletics, multi skills, dance, swimming.</li> <li>• Children showing sporting aptitude and passion trained in school squads and academy squads.</li> <li>• Sporting success and participation of all children celebrated through assemblies, newsletter, website etc. Creating an academy boys and girls football team and swimming team raised aspiration, we had planned to do the same for netball, athletics and cricket but this was postponed due to COVID.</li> <li>• Popularity of clubs and competitions has raised allowing for a larger scope of activities to have taken part and be planned for.</li> <li>• Staff changes have had an impact and level of participation in competition has increased on last year and we had planned for further competitions but for COVID.</li> </ul>	<p><b>£1400</b></p>
