Curriculum Overview- What experiences did children in Dover have during the Second World War?

In our history lessons we will be learning about the key countries involved in WWII and the influential people involved in the decision making. We will consider the impact of significant events in our locality and use a range of sources to support this.

English

In our English lessons this term, we will be reading 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. This text will be used to write emotive diary entries, newspaper reports and a chronological report. We will be using the character's experiences within the text and our own knowledge through exploring primary sources to apply the skills within these genres.

Maths

In our Number lessons, we will look at ratio, proportion and algebra. We will explore these areas whilst also applying them to problem solving and reasoning questions.

Our focus in our Topic lessons will be on statistics to collect, present and interpret data. We will continually focus on arithmetic skills to ensure we are confident in the four key operations.

SPELLING SPOTLIGHT

We will be exploring a new focus within our spelling sessions with a program called Sir Linkalot. This helps pupils to link their spellings to remember them, we will look at a range of spellings over the term.
