English

Using these texts, we will explore a range of genres and their features to develop our writing skills. This term we will focus on setting descriptions, persuasive writing, adverts and haiku poems linked to protecting our wonderful planet. Our reading skills are: Understand and Explain and Vocabulary.

Maths

Within our Number lessons we will focus on recognising place value including decimals numbers to hundredths, focusing on questions to do with measurements and money.

In our Topic lessons we will investigate converting kg to g, km to m and l to ml, as well as understanding what area means and finding areas of rectangular shapes. Times tables: We will be revisiting all our time tables and answering them within 6 seconds using Mathsframe.
