



Curriculum overview- Ancient Egyptians

Who were the Ancient Egyptians and what evidence about them still exists today?

Why do we learn about ancient civilisations? Who were the Ancient Egyptians and how do we know about them? As budding historians, we will travel back in time and develop our knowledge and understanding of how their lives were different to ours and their legacy today. When studying history, we are looking in the mirror at ourselves – looking both backwards and forwards. History helps us understand who we are as society now, how we got here, and what we learned along the way. When looking at ancient history, Ancient Egypt has some of the most incredible, compelling, exciting puzzles and mysteries that can be found in studying how humanity began forming civilizations.

English

During our English and writing lessons we will explore the text 'Slip Scarab' and 'Awesome Egyptians'. Within these lessons we will unpick the features of the text and explore the authors choices. These skills will then help us write our own story. Our non fiction text will help us write an instructional text followed by a newspaper report.

Maths

Our math's lessons will involve developing our confidence in understanding multiplication and division facts. This will include ensuring we are confident in a range of times table facts allowing us to count in our 6's, 7's, 9's and 100's. We will also be exploring the topic of statistics where we will look at interpreting and presenting data in a variety of ways.
