Content refers to the information children may encounter online. Parents should encourage discussions about appropriate and inappropriate material.

Contact emphasises the importance of understanding who children are communicating with online; fostering open dialogue about their online friendships is vital.

Conduct involves the behaviour exhibited online; teaching children about cyberbullying and respect is essential.

Lastly, Commerce highlights the need to understand online purchases and subscriptions. Encourage children to seek parental guidance before engaging in any financial transactions online.
