



## Curriculum Overview-

As hard-working historians we will learn all about 1666, when a Great Fire spread through the city of London, destroying over 13,200 houses, over 80 churches, St Paul's Cathedral and most of the other buildings. Prior to the fire, houses were mainly built out of wood and were very close together.

What impact did this event have on our lives today? In this topic, we will journey back in time and explore what life was like back in 1666 and how we learned from the past to make housing safer today.

## English -

In English this term we will be looking at word types and using a range of these in our writing to give more impact and excitement.

We will be writing about 'The Great Fire of London' and will be learning and developing our use of writing explanation texts.

## Maths -

In maths we will start by looking at 2D and 3D shapes and their properties.
